One of the most important aspects of a color change is using the correct type of paint and sheen. When choosing colors, look for colors that won't change, like roof and stone on the exterior and flooring and cupboards on the interior. This will help guide you to a certain color family.

Maintenance vs. Re-paints.

Maintaining your exterior surfaces is far less expensive than repainting the whole house. Often when our customers call us for exterior work we find that all surfaces need to be scheduled for repainting.

A full repaint consists of scraping, sanding, priming, and washing, in addition to painting all surfaces. In contrast, maintaining your surfaces gives you the ability to re-coat areas before the weather breaks down the paint and begins peeling and flaking thus eliminating a lot of prep work and associated expenses. Your wood stays protected and your home stays looking great.

D.I.Y. Tip #1 Never work out of the paint can!

Always paint using a clean and only partially filled work pot. (only half of your brush should be submerged in paint). After loading your brush instead of wiping off the excess paint at the top of pail, you should gently slap your brush from side to side inside the bucket removing excess without de-loading it. Between tasks, keep your work pot covered with a damp rag to prevent drying, skinning and dust from entering. This will also keep your brush wet, making it easier to work with and faster to clean-up.
