Volatile Organic Compounds

VOCs are emitted as gasses from certain solids or liquids. VOCs include a variety of chemicals, some of which may have short- and long-term adverse health effects. Concentrations of many VOCs are consistently higher indoors (up to 10 times higher) than outdoors. VOCs are emitted by a wide array of products numbering in the thousands. Examples include: paints and lacquers, cleaning supplies, pesticides, building materials and furnishings, office equipment such as copiers and printers, correction fluids and carbonless copy paper, graphics and craft materials including glues and adhesives, permanent markers, and photographic solutions. Do-It-Yourself Tip

Always read and follow the manufacturer's recommendations on surface preparation, applications and clean-up information. This will benefit you in the event of a problem with the freshly painted surface. Generally, today's paints are guaranteed against failures if you have properly prepared and correctly applied the coating. Also pay attention to temperatures, humidity and dry times between coats which can adversely affect the integrity of the finish.
